Biography:

A towering second-rower, Heilum Luki was signed to the Cowboys' Cairns Academy in 2016 as a 15-year-old.

Luki starred for the Northern Pride Under 20s in 2019 and was a standout in the Cowboys' Academy team's triumph over the Titans Academy later that season.

In his maiden Queensland Cup season for the Northern Pride in 2021, Luki averaged 140 running metres and five tackle breaks a game.

The Cairns Brothers junior was called up to make his NRL in Round 11 against the Knights, scoring in the 36-20 win in Townsville.

Luki went on to play 11 games in his debut season, scoring three tries and picking up the Cowboys' Rookie of the Year award.
