A Message from the Director of School Campus

Several reports of students engaging in cyberbullying and inappropriate online behaviour have recently been reported. It is important that parents and caregivers are aware of what their children are doing online. Last week, I spent a lot of time looking into inappropriate at-home online behaviour. Children can't handle all the information and emotional back-and-forth comments, requests for comments, videos, and so on that they get online, so we have to set limits and rules for them, even though they don't like it.

A responsible adult locking and putting away phones and tablets at a specific time at night is a simple way to ensure kids get a good night's sleep while avoiding unwanted and tempting communications. 
